WELCOME ÕHUA TO OUR HAPORI



A little behind the name: Ōhua is a lunar phase in the Maramataka – the Māori lunar calendar. Hua also means seeds/ eggs. Ōhua is associated with high energy, new beginnings, a good day for planting.

The guiding pou of Ōhua derive from Te Marautanga o Kahungunu ki Wairarapa. These are: Whakapapa, Whanaungatanga, Wairuatanga, Manaakitanga, Rangatiratanga, Mana Whenua, and Kaitiakitanga.

We know Dee and the team will do great mahi for our tamariki and whānau here in Whakaoriori, and we look forward to supporting them through our workstreams...it take a village.


