

ECE LITERACY VISITS

During Term 3 and 4 the Progressions workstream and the Teaching and Learning workstream connected on a Early Literacy project in ECE Centres. Primary kaiako visited a range of ECE centres to talk with the kaiako and discuss what structured literacy looks like in primary schools. The teachers modelled a picture book session and discussed vocabulary development and oral language in the early years.



ENGLISH CLUSTER MEETING

On the 29th of August the Teaching and Learning Workstream connected with the Secondary English cluster to gather ideas about the areas of need in literacy learning at secondary schools across Whakaoriori. From this planning for the workstream began.

CONNECTION WITH SOUTH WAIRARAPA KāHUI AKO

From the English Cluster hui came the opportunity to connect with South Wairarapa Kāhui Ako and connect with the mahi they have already done in this space. This provided additional ideas and directions for the workstream, particularly around the CAAs and sharing the information with kaiako of year 7 & 8 and the work around learning progressions.



CURRENT PROJECT

An Al Focus Group is being set up.

This group will explore using technology in the literacy space with a specific focus on differentiation and helping students access the curriculum.







CONNECTING SECONDARY AND PRIMARY

Members of the workstream were invited into a primary classroom to observe BSLA in action. The aim was to strengthen connections and create awareness of one of the current Structured Literacy approaches being used in our primary schools.

It was so cool seeing structured literacy in action in a Year 2 and 3 classroom. I could see clear links between what they were working on and what we are doing in our Year 9, 10 and 11 structured literacy classes at Wairarapa College. The students were so engaged and really enjoyed what they were doing.



PLANS FOR 2025

The Year 7 - 10 area of the workstream is just getting started! The data that is gathered will be used to plan for 2025.

There are a range of possible projects for next year including:

- CAA presentation from secondary teachers to intermediate teachers
- Setting up opportunities for collaboration between intermediate/ college
- CAA presentation from secondary teachers to intermediate teachers this is what Year 10 students need to be able to do before this assessment
- Structured Literacy for older learners
- Investigate ministry funding or expert partners to help with the Whakaoriori framework / scope and sequence

CONCLUSION

The Teaching and Learning team have been on a huge learning journey this year. The current government direction has shaped many of the decisions and actions that were taken but we hold true to the voice we collected at the beginning of this journey. Our focus continues to be on fostering strong connections and opportunities for collaboration across Whakaoriori schools.
